



## National Videogame Museum Scholarship Application

The National Videogame Museum will award **four** \$1,500 scholarships to students enrolling in any four-year college or university, full-time for the 2021-2022 term. This is a **non-renewing**, single-term scholarship.

All applicants should be pursuing careers in either a videogame or technology-based field. Applicants may apply for one or more scholarships but will only be awarded one scholarship total. Scholarships will be awarded to one applicant in each of the following four categories:

- **Frisco, Texas Resident**
  - Frisco is home to the National Videogame Museum, and the museum would like to award one applicant within Frisco city limits.
- **Women in Technology**
  - Videogame design and technology fields have traditionally been male-dominated. In an effort to bring more diversity to these fields, this scholarship will be awarded to the most qualified female applicant.
  - Applicants for this scholarship must be female and the application must be marked as “female” in the gender category.
- **Texas Resident**
  - Applicants must be a current resident of the state of Texas.
    - Texas residents attending out-of-state colleges will be considered in this category.
- **Texas Resident – Title 1 School Graduate**
  - Applicants must be a current resident of the state of Texas AND must be graduating from state of Texas designated Title 1 school.
  - Applicant must also submit a letter indicating their family household income letter. Families with income greater than \$50,000/year will not be considered for this scholarship.

### ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for any of these scholarships, applicants must meet or exceed the following requirements:

- High School Senior scheduled to graduate in the Spring of 2021.
- GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- One letter of recommendation from a teacher in their graduating high school.

- This letter should highlight any skills or experience related to technology, computer programming or videogame design the instructor may have first-hand knowledge of.
- The recommendation letter might also make mention of any qualities the instructor has observed in the applicant that might lead him or her believe the applicant has an extraordinary chance at achieving their goals.
- One letter of recommendation from an unrelated community member who can attest to the applicant's community involvement.
  - This letter should cite specific instances where the applicant has volunteered his or her time to the benefit of the local civic or church community, for example.
- Applicant to submit a completed application
- Applicant to submit a 500-750-word essay explaining his or her academic and professional goals and how the scholarship will help to achieve them.
  - The applicant should cite his or her intended major, career choice and any extracurricular activities or hobbies they are or were involved in that might support the interest in their career path.
  - Briefly discuss reasons why you might stand-out from the other applicants.
  - Some information on past academic successes or even challenges that were overcome might also help the selection committee.
  - If there is a specific financial hardship the applicant has to overcome, it should be mentioned here.
- A natural-born or naturalized US citizen.
- Proof of residency such as a driver's license or state-issued ID.

It is very important to note that the scholarship money will be paid directly to the educational institution specifically for tuition. It cannot be used for housing, meals or other expenses without prior authorization from the National Videogame Museum Scholarship administrator. Only in very special cases will the money be authorized for purposes other than tuition. The amount awarded will be split between the fall and spring semesters.
