

National Videogame Museum Scholarship Application

This year the National Videogame Museum will award a total of five scholarships. **Three** \$2,000 scholarships and **one** \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to H.S. students enrolling in any four-year college or university, full-time for the 2026-2027 term. An additional \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to a current undergraduate college student. All of these awards are **non-renewing**, single-term scholarships.

All applicants should be pursuing careers in a technology-based field. Applicants may apply for one or more scholarship categories simply by checking the appropriate boxes for those scholarships they qualify for. Applicants not selected for a particular scholarship will be rolled into the pool for the next scholarship they are eligible for. Applicants cannot win more than one scholarship category. Scholarships will be awarded to one applicant in each of the following five categories:

Amie Dansby Women in Technology Award – H.S. Senior (\$5,000 awarded)

- Various technology career paths including videogame design have traditionally been male-dominated. In an effort to bring more diversity to these fields, this scholarship will be awarded to the most qualified female applicant.
- o This scholarship is open to H.S. Seniors across the United States.
- Applicants for this scholarship must be female and the application must be marked as "female" in the gender category.

Amie Dansby Women in Technology Award – College Undergraduate (\$5,000 awarded)

- Various technology career paths including videogame design have traditionally been male-dominated. In an effort to bring more diversity to these fields, this scholarship will be awarded to the most qualified female applicant.
- This scholarship is open to current College Undergraduates across the United States.
- Applicants for this scholarship must be female and the application must be marked as "female" in the gender category.

Frisco, Texas Resident (\$2,000 awarded)

 Frisco is home to the National Videogame Museum, and the museum would like to award one applicant residing within the Frisco city limits.

• Texas Resident (\$2,000 awarded)

- o Applicants must be a current resident of the state of Texas.
 - Texas residents attending out-of-state colleges will be considered in this category.

• Texas Resident – Title 1 School Graduate (\$2,000 awarded)

- Applicants must be a current resident of the state of Texas AND must be graduating from a state of Texas designated Title 1 school.
- o In order to qualify for this award, applicant must also submit a separate statement letter indicating their family household income is less than \$50,000/year.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for any of these scholarships, applicants must meet or exceed the following requirements:

- High School Senior scheduled to graduate in the Spring of 2026.
- Amie Dansby College Undergraduate applicant must be continuing their education in Fall 2026.
- GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- A natural-born or naturalized US citizen.
- Proof of residency such as a driver's license or state-issued ID.
- Applicant to submit a completed application along with all required documents.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- One letter of recommendation from a teacher at their graduating high school or current college.
 - This letter should highlight any skills or experiences related to technology, computer programming or videogame design the instructor may have first-hand knowledge of.
 - The recommendation letter might also make mention of any qualities the instructor
 has observed in the applicant that might lead him or her believe the applicant has an
 extraordinary chance at achieving their goals.
- One letter of recommendation from an unrelated community member who can attest to the applicant's community involvement.
 - This letter should cite specific instances where the applicant has volunteered his or her time to the benefit of any local, civic or church communities.
- Applicant to submit an essay (500 word minimum) explaining his or her academic and professional goals and how the scholarship will help to achieve them.
 - The applicant should cite his or her intended major, career choice and any extracurricular activities or hobbies they are or were involved in that might support the interest in their career path.
 - o Briefly discuss reasons why you might stand-out from the other applicants.
 - Feel free to include information on past academic successes, or challenges that were overcome as a way of showcasing your strengths and determination.
 - If there is a specific financial hardship the applicant has to overcome, it should be mentioned here.

It is very important to note that the scholarship money will be paid directly to the educational institution specifically for tuition. It cannot be used for housing, meals or other expenses without prior authorization from the National Videogame Museum Scholarship administrator. Only in very special cases will the money be authorized for purposes other than tuition.
